Admission into the Paramedic Program. All Classes must be taken in sequence.

Perform a comprehensive patient assessment, formulate and implement a treatment plan on adult patients with dyspnea/respiratory distress at least the minimum number of times required by the accrediting agency. Perform a comprehensive patient assessment, formulate and implement a treatment plan on pediatric patients (including infants, toddlers, and school age) with dyspnea/respiratory distress at least the minimum number of times required by the accrediting agency. Perform a comprehensive patient assessment, formulate and implement a treatment plan on patients with syncope at least the minimum number of times required by the accrediting agency. Properly document skill performed.

Perform a comprehensive patient assessment, formulate and implement a treatment plan on patients with abdominal complaints at least the minimum number of times required by the accrediting agency. Properly document skill performed.

Perform a comprehensive patient assessment, formulate and implement a treatment plan on patients with altered mental status at least the minimum number of times required by the accrediting agency. Properly document skill performed.
